Defibrillator

To keep our children and staff as safe as possible we have installed a defibrillator on site. The unit has been fitted on the side of the building in the car park just in front of the garden gate.

Our defibrillator has been registered on 'The Circuit', the national network which maps defibrillators across the UK, connecting them directly and automatically to each ambulance service.

Locating the defibrillator in the car park ensures 24-hour access not only by the team at St George's, but also by the local community in an emergency.

We emailed parents this week to let them know about this new addition and wanted to share this supportive comment.

After School Club




Moles
