TRAINING

Throughout the year we invest in our staff and arrange different types of training, ensuring their knowledge is up to date. Last month the staff in Squirrels had a course called "babies are amazing".

The training focused on the importance of secure attachment. A secure attachment provides a child with a strong base to support their learning and independent play.

The training provided tools for staff to evaluate their practice by focusing on each individual child's attachment and the impact this has on their learning and development.

We focused on different ways that children signal for their needs to be met and how we can ensure that we pick up on these ques. Children that feel heard and valued are more likely to seek communication and engagement with others. Leanna specifically took away from the training the importance of a parent saying goodbye to their child before they leave as this supports children to develop and adapt to natural transitions.

In the coming months staff will be given refresher courses on Paediatric First Aid as well as Safeguarding.

As a non-profit organisation, St George's continues to invest any profits back into the business and one area we are concentrating on is the upkeep of the building.



Squirrels
